PUBLIC NOTICE OF INTENT TO REISSUE A WISCONSIN POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (WPDES) PERMIT No.WI-0032026-10-0

Permittee: Delafield Hartland Water Pollution Control Commission, 416 Butler Drive, Delafield, WI, 53018-1871

Facility Where Discharge Occurs: Delafield Hartland Water Pollution Control C, 416 Butler Drive Delafield, WI 53018-1871

Receiving Water And Location: Bark River in Bark River Watershed of Lower Rock River Basin in Waukesha County

Brief Facility Description: Delafield-Hartland Water Pollution Control Commission owns and operates a 3.23 MGD extended aeration activated sludge plant, which commenced operation in May 2004. Treatment process includes bar screening and grit removal, primary clarification, anaerobic and anoxic zones for biological phosphorus removal, extended aeration activated sludge treatment, final clarification, and tertiary treatment via disc filters. Seasonal disinfection is accomplished using a UV light system. The facility treats waste activated sludge into a class B cake sludge that is taken to a licensed and permitted contract hauler for beneficial reuse. Delafield Hartfield facility is a regional facility and serves the City of Delafield, the Villages of Hartland, Nashotah, and Summit, and the Town of Delafield.

The Department has tentatively decided that the above-specified WPDES permit should be reissued.

Persons wishing to comment on or object to the proposed permit action, or to request a public hearing, may write to the Department of Natural Resources at the above-named permit drafter's address. All comments or suggestions received no later than 30 days after the publication date of this public notice will be considered along with other information on file in making a final decision regarding the permit. Anyone providing comments in response to this public notice will receive a notification of the Department's final decision when the permit is issued. Where designated as a reviewable surface water discharge permit, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency is allowed up to 90 days to submit comments or objections regarding this permit determination. If no comments are received on the proposed permit from anyone, including U.S. EPA, the permit will be issued as proposed.

The Department may schedule a public informational hearing if requested by any person and shall schedule a public informational hearing if a petition requesting a hearing is received from 5 or more persons or if response to this notice indicates significant public interest pursuant to s. 283.49, Wis. Stats. Requests for a public informational hearing shall state the following: the name and address of the person(s) requesting the hearing; the interest in the proposed permit of the person(s) requesting the hearing; the reasons for the request; and the issues proposed to be considered at the hearing.

Information on file for this permit action, including the draft permit, fact sheet and permit application, may be inspected and copied at either the above-named permit drafter's office or the above named basin engineer's office, Monday through Friday (except holidays), between 9:00 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. Please call the permit drafter or basin engineer for directions to their office location, if necessary.
