PUBLIC NOTICE OF INTENT TO MODIFY A WISCONSIN POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (WPDES) PERMIT No.WI-0020192-10-1

Permittee: Hartford Water Pollution Control Facility, 109 N Main St, Hartford, WI 53027

Facility Where Discharge Occurs: Hartford Water Pollution Control Facility, 1600 Liberty Ave, Hartford WI

Receiving Water And Location: Rubicon River (Rubicon River Watershed, Upper Rock River Basin) in Washington County

Brief Facility Description: The City of Hartford operates a 3.6 million gallon per day (MGD) activated sludge wastewater treatment facility that serves approximately 17,000 people and seven significant industries. Treatment consists of screening, grit removal, three-ring oxidation ditch that was upgraded to allow for biological phosphorus removal, final clarification, anthracite filters, and ultraviolet disinfection. Cascade steps at the end of the discharge flume provide additional aeration before the effluent is discharged to the Rubicon River. Biosolids processes include gravity settling, and liquid sludge storage before being land applied onto Department approved agricultural fields. Based on data reported during the permit term, the plant is currently operating at about 60% of its maximum monthly design flow and 53% of its design BOD loading.

Proposed Modification: The permit modification is proposed to reduce the effluent PFOS/PFOA sampling frequency from 1/ 2 months to quarterly, after a review of submitted data, pursuant to s. NR 205.066, Wis. Adm. Code.

The Department has tentatively decided that the above-specified WPDES permit should be modified.

Persons wishing to comment on or object to the proposed permit action, or to request a public hearing, may write to the Department of Natural Resources at the above-named permit drafter's address. All comments or suggestions received no later than 30 days after the publication date of this public notice will be considered along with other information on file in making a final decision regarding the permit. Anyone providing comments in response to this public notice will receive a notification of the Department's final decision when the permit is issued. Where designated as a reviewable surface water discharge permit, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency is allowed up to 90 days to submit comments or objections regarding this permit determination. If no comments are received on the proposed permit from anyone, including U.S. EPA, the permit will be issued as proposed.

The Department may schedule a public informational hearing if requested by any person and shall schedule a public informational hearing if a petition requesting a hearing is received from 5 or more persons or if response to this notice indicates significant public interest pursuant to s. 283.49, Wis. Stats. Requests for a public informational hearing shall state the following: the name and address of the person(s) requesting the hearing; the interest in the proposed permit of the person(s) requesting the hearing; the reasons for the request; and the issues proposed to be considered at the hearing.

Information on file for this permit action, including the draft permit, fact sheet and permit application, may be inspected and copied at either the above-named permit drafter's office or the above named basin engineer's office, Monday through Friday (except holidays), between 9:00 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. Please call the permit drafter or basin engineer for directions to their office location, if necessary.
