## PUBLIC NOTICE OF INTENT TO MODIFY A WISCONSIN POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (WPDES) PERMIT No.WI-0029289-09-3

Permittee: KIELER SANITARY DISTRICT No 1, 3854 Kilian Ln, Kieler, WI 53812

Facility Where Discharge Occurs: Kieler Sanitary District No 1 WWTF, 3854 KILIAN LANE, KIELER, WI

Receiving Water And Location: The headwaters of Sinnipee Creek, approximately 60 feet from the SW corner of the WWTP building at 3854 Kilian Lane, Kieler, WI 53812. Located in the SE <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> of SE <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Section 33, T2N, R2W, Grant County.

Brief Facility Description : Kieler Sanitary District No. 1 is an existing discharger and operates a wastewater treatment plant with an annual average design capacity of 0.091 MGD. The actual annual average flow from July 2016 to June 2021 was 0.067 MGD. The Sanitary District operates a small, activated sludge oxidation ditch with influent screw screen and final clarification. Effluent is disinfected via chlorination/dechlorination prior to discharge to the headwaters of Sinnipee Creek. Sludge handling and treatment consists of a two-cell storage tank with additional storage planned and final disposal to department approved land application sites.

Proposed Modification: The permit modification is proposed to reduce the effluent PFOS/PFOA sampling frequency from 1/2 months to annual, after a review of submitted data, pursuant to s. NR 205.066, Wis. Adm. Code.

The Department has tentatively decided that the above-specified WPDES permit should be modified.

Persons wishing to comment on or object to the proposed permit action, or to request a public hearing, may write to the Department of Natural Resources at the above-named permit drafter's address. All comments or suggestions received no later than 30 days after the publication date of this public notice will be considered along with other information on file in making a final decision regarding the permit. Anyone providing comments in response to this public notice will receive a notification of the Department's final decision when the permit is issued. Where designated as a reviewable surface water discharge permit, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency is allowed up to 90 days to submit comments or objections regarding this permit determination. If no comments are received on the proposed permit from anyone, including U.S. EPA, the permit will be issued as proposed.

The Department may schedule a public informational hearing if requested by any person and shall schedule a public informational hearing if a petition requesting a hearing is received from 5 or more persons or if response to this notice indicates significant public interest pursuant to s. 283.49, Wis. Stats. Requests for a public informational hearing shall state the following: the name and address of the person(s) requesting the hearing; the interest in the proposed permit of the person(s) requesting the hearing; the reasons for the request; and the issues proposed to be considered at the hearing.

Information on file for this permit action, including the draft permit, fact sheet and permit application, may be inspected and copied at either the above-named permit drafter's office or the above named basin engineer's office, Monday through Friday (except holidays), between 9:00 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. Please call the permit drafter or basin engineer for directions to their office location, if necessary.
