PUBLIC NOTICE OF INTENT TO MODIFY A WISCONSIN POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (WPDES) PERMIT No.WI-0028843-11-1

Permittee: VILLAGE OF WEBSTER, PO Box 25, Webster, WI 54893

Facility Where Discharge Occurs: Village of Webster, Sec 16; T39N-R16W

Receiving Water And Location: A ditch tributary to the Clam River within the Clam River watershed in the St. Croix River Drainage basin in Burnett County

Brief Facility Description: The Village of Webster owns and operates a domestic wastewater treatment system. The plant is designed to treat 85,000 gallons per day and currently treats an average of 52,000 gallons per day. The treatment system consists of three stabilization ponds operated one after another (in series). Within these ponds naturally occurring bacteria and organisms already present in the wastewater metabolize organic matter. The permittee is authorized to discharge as a fill-and-draw system during the months of April, May, September and October. Effluent is discharged to a drainage ditch that empties into the Clam River in Burnett County.

Proposed Modification: The Department has made the determination that this facility has reasonable potential to cause or contribute to an exceedance of the PFOS standard in s. NR 102.04(8)(d)1., Wis. Adm. Code. Language has been added to the permit requiring the implementation of a PFOS Minimization Plan. The PFOS/PFOA monitoring frequency has been decreased to monthly during periods of discharge. Additionally, the quarters in which total nitrogen monitoring is required (in 2026, 2027, and 2028) have changed to align with actual discharge periods. Lastly, interim due dates and required actions in both the Effluent Limits for BOD5 and Phosphorus compliance schedules have been updated to align with final construction plans and financial assistance requests.

The Department has tentatively decided that the above-specified WPDES permit should be modified.

Persons wishing to comment on or object to the proposed permit action, or to request a public hearing, may write to the Department of Natural Resources at the above-named permit drafter's address. All comments or suggestions received no later than 30 days after the publication date of this public notice will be considered along with other information on file in making a final decision regarding the permit. Anyone providing comments in response to this public notice will receive a notification of the Department's final decision when the permit is issued. Where designated as a reviewable surface water discharge permit, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency is allowed up to 90 days to submit comments or objections regarding this permit determination. If no comments are received on the proposed permit from anyone, including U.S. EPA, the permit will be issued as proposed.

The Department may schedule a public informational hearing if requested by any person and shall schedule a public informational hearing if a petition requesting a hearing is received from 5 or more persons or if response to this notice indicates significant public interest pursuant to s. 283.49, Wis. Stats. Requests for a public informational hearing shall state the following: the name and address of the person(s) requesting the hearing; the interest in the proposed permit of the person(s) requesting the hearing; the reasons for the request; and the issues proposed to be considered at the hearing.

Information on file for this permit action, including the draft permit, fact sheet and permit application, may be inspected and copied at either the above-named permit drafter's office or the above named basin engineer's office, Monday through Friday (except holidays), between 9:00 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. Please call the permit drafter or basin engineer for directions to their office location, if necessary.
