

RENEWALS FOR 2026 BEGIN 10/01/2025 - ALL LICENSES EXPIRE 12/31/2025

RENEW ONLINE: [Environmental Licensing and Certification Online Renewal Portal \(wi.gov\)](https://www.wisconsin.gov/licensesandregistrations/renewal)

- Renewing online will save you time and postage.
- License cards are immediately available for printing – no waiting for arrival by mail.
- No transaction fee is required when renewal fees are paid by electronic transfer from your bank.
- Problems associated with paper “renewal by mail” application forms are avoided:
 - Old or incorrect mailing address on record at the DNR (you do not receive the application)
 - Rig operator and business renewal applications are not signed by the supervisor
 - Registration renewal applications are submitted before the supervisor has renewed
 - Wrong fee payment or missing late fees when an application is mailed after December 31

TWO STEPS TO RENEW:

1. *You need to be eligible for renewal:*

- Check your CE attendance status online: [Driller/Pump Installer Continuing Education Status \(wi.gov\)](https://www.wisconsin.gov/licensesandregistrations/ce)
- Individual license holders become eligible after attending 6 hours of continuing education.
- Business registrants become eligible after their supervisor has renewed.
- Rig operator registrants become eligible:
 - after attending 6 hours of continuing education
 - after their supervisor and their employer have renewed

2. *Apply for renewal online or by mail:*

- The online renewal portal opens October 1.
- Hard copy renewal forms are mailed to all eligible applicants starting October 1.
- Periodic mailings go out to all who become eligible up to November 30, 2025.
- Disregard an application you receive by mail if you have already renewed online.
- No renewal will be mailed to applicants who become eligible for renewal after November 30.
- All licensees and registrants who become eligible after November 30 must renew online.

Online e-Payment Services tips:

- Select “[Pay Without Registering](#)” at the bottom of the page.
- You could also select “[Register](#)” to create an [e-Payment Services](#) account. With an account, you have the ability to log in using the *User ID* and *Password* that you create to pay fees without reentering bank or credit card account information for each renewal. This is preferred by those who need to process several renewals.
- Most applicants use the “[Pay Without Registering](#)” option.
